Welcome back. Students have settled into their new classes and are looking forward to a great 2018.

We will once again this year, have a number of Intervention Programs at The Pines in Literacy and Numeracy. Students are selected for intervention after examining each child's data. If your child is selected for extra support, you should receive a note explaining the type of intervention they can be involved in. Students with disabilities also receive extra support each year.

Over the first few weeks, our classes have been working on our new social skills program, Positive Education. Students will also be working on our school values—Respect, Belonging and Fun/Engagement in Learning. To celebrate returning to school and a good start to the school year, we will once again have the Big Splash on the 15th February. Swimming lessons will also be held towards the end of the term.

This year we are once again working with our students to develop powerful learners. Powerful learners have a 'Growth Mindset': the belief that they are capable of learning and achieving with effort. Our work developing powerful learners also includes working with students to build resilience; building learners who keep trying even when work is hard, are not afraid to make mistakes, are resourceful and responsible. We look forward to working in partnership with families to maximize student wellbeing and achievement.

All classes were open for acquaintance evening this week to meet teachers. It was good to see many families attend. At the end of this term, we will hold parent/caregiver/teacher interviews.

Our school Annual General Meeting where we table our 2017 Annual Report and elect our new Governing Council, will be held on Wednesday 28th February in the staffroom. All are invited to attend.

### **Positive Education at The Pines**



This year The Pines School has started implementing 'Positive Education' into classrooms and across the school.

Positive Education uses the PERMA model to support children's well-being.

- P Positive Emotions: Feeling positive emotions such as joy, gratitude, interest, hope.
- E Engagement: Being fully absorbed in activities that use your skills yet challenge you.
- R Relationships: Having positive relationships.
- M Meaning: Belonging to and serving something you believe is bigger than yourself.
- A Accomplishment: Pursuing success, winning achievement and mastery.

#### So What Is Positive Education?

Positive education is the combination of traditional education with the study of happiness and well-being, using Seligman's **PERMA** model and **Values in Action** (**VIA**) classification. Positive Education incorporates 'positive psychology' into education to decrease depression in younger people and enhance well-being and happiness.

Positive education emphasises the importance of training the heart as well as the mind in education. Positive education programs usually define positive character as 'core character strengths' that are represented in the VIA's six categories of virtue. The goal of positive education is to help reveal and develop the child's ability to effectively engage their combination of character strengths.





#### How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

#### For Phone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, dick "Gel" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download. 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

### For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users.

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search

3. Install the Skoolbag app

4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.

5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.

6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App. then "Setup" 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tagging the on/off switch.

Please Note: The Skoolbag Windows App is for 81 version Windows Phones, or Windows

81 and 10 devices.

#### For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device

2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help

3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.

4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).

6. Click "Open" when installed.

7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".

8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.
