Jolly Phonics and Jolly Grammar

Recently all staff were involved in training in Jolly Phonics and Jolly Grammar. Staff stayed at school till 8:30pm and were involved in an exceptional training session run by an expert educator in this field. Jolly Phonics is a systematic approach to the teaching of phonics, grammar, spelling and punctuation across the school years. The teaching is multi-sensory and active, with fun actions, stories and songs as well as interactive on line resources.

The focus of the training was on how to further develop student skills in phonics (the understanding and use of sounds in the English language) to improve reading and writing. Developing strong skills in phonics in the early years is extremely important as this builds strong foundations for future literacy skill development. Maintaining this understanding through grammar and spelling in the older years is equally as important. This is not new work for our school but it is important work that will continue. Every student's literacy development is monitored and students are supported to ensure they are making continuous progress.

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Parent Passports

This year we will be trialling 'Parent Passports'. These passports are for parents and caregivers to actively engage with their child(ren) and their learning. 


DECD Swimming Program
