We wish all students a safe holiday. Mid-year reports are being sent home this week.

Reading is a very important priority at The Pines. Recently I've met with our mainstream teachers from year 1 to year 7 to discuss each child's reading progress over the last 2 terms. It's been pleasing to see so many of our students at appropriate reading levels for their age/ grade. Students behind what is expected are involved in intervention and teachers also support them with strategies in class. also implement strategies accelerate the reading progress of students ahead of what is expected in reading their age.

There are many elements to developing fluency and comprehension in reading and our literacy programs concentrate on developing these elements. The development of phonological awareness, phonics, oral language, vocabulary and comprehension are priorities.

Families can assist their child's reading development by encouraging reading at home, reading aloud to children, listening to children read and discussing with them what they are reading, to check for understanding. Talking to children and teaching them new words also assist reading development.

Next term, we will offer workshops to families with further information about our school literacy program and how to assist children at home with reading.

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

If you would like to donate non-perishable items for our community cupboard which is available for staff to give to families in our community that are struggling. You can find the box in the breakfast club room.




































Room 44 and 43 Book Making!
