'Bullieve' in Yourself Poster Competition

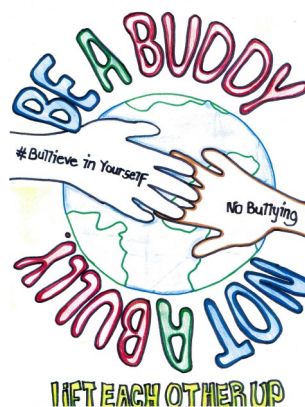
