At The Pines School we focus on the important attributes of being a respectful, kind and responsible person. Teachers work with their classes on the character strengths in Positive Education. This term classes have been focusing on Curiosity and Creativity. Additionally, the Reception to Year 2 classes will focus on Humour, Years 3-5 will focus on Perspective and Years 6-7 on Zest.

We have a new mural in the courtyard between the staffroom and office, displaying the Positive Education character strengths.

Safety is also a major priority at our school and it's so important that our school families drive slowly and carefully near our school. This small drop off area allows families to drop off their children safely, by a school gate and then move on. No-one should be parked in this area. Parking is available on the streets surrounding the school, as well as in the carpark adjacent to the school, next to the Football / Cricket/ Soccer Clubrooms.

School Banking is a fun, interactive and engaging way for students to learn about money and develop good savings habits. For each weekly deposit made at school, students will receive a silver Dollarmites token. Once they collect 10 tokens, they can redeem them for a School Banking reward.

If your child has previously participated in School Banking, or has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account, they can start banking straight away by bringing their Dollarmites deposit wallet to school on School Banking day.

If your child has lost their book, they can bring their money to school in a sealed envelope with a note on School Banking day and we will issue them with a replacement book.

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The Pines Refundable Program



Last term Mr Mark and Room 29 worked together to collect the refundable drink containers that children throw away at The Pines. We put out containers next to the outside

rubbish bins in the yard and all students know to remove the straws and place their finished drink containers in these tubs. Room 29 then collects the tubs each Friday, removes any straws and empties any liquid that has been left in the drink containers.

What we have noticed

We have noticed that many children are not drinking their drinks and in some cases children are not even opening them and are throwing drinks in the bin unopened. This is a terrible waste of money and resources.

What you can do

With climate action as a global priority, we are asking that parents/caregivers speak to their children about the drinks they are purchasing at the canteen or bringing to school. You could talk to your child about changing their drink choice to something that they might prefer and will drink. 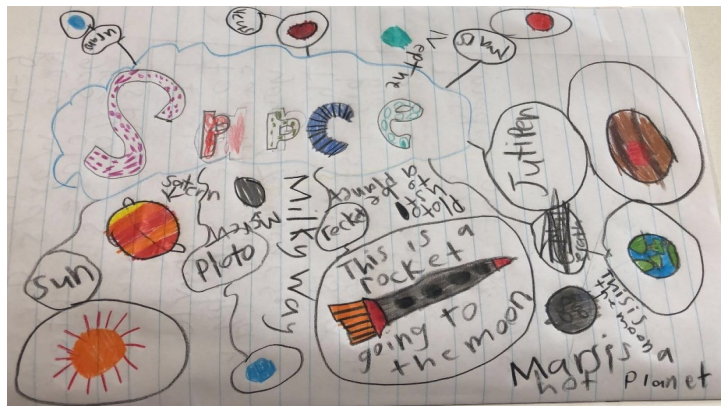
As a school we are committed to a sustainable future and any information would be useful to reducing waste at The Pines School.
