Dear families,

Please see the below information about easing of restrictions due to the decrease in COVID-19 cases in our State.

At school, we will continue to keep up hygiene practices and appreciate your support in keeping our school a safe place. This includes driving slowly and carefully on roads around our school. Parking in the correct parking areas also, assists to keep our students safe and is respectful to our school community.

Since parents/caregivers have been dropping students off at gates, I have noticed over time how well our students have managed coming into school and getting organised each morning. Even our young reception students have developed excellent skills in organising themselves including organising their bags, drink bottles and readers. This self-organisation has developed student's confidence as well.

#### COVID-19 Update - Step 3 Advice

The Premier has announced Step 3 of the COVID-19 roadmap. This means some restrictions will be eased for schools, preschools and early year's settings from Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> June, the last week of this term.

Physical distancing requirements remain in place for adults. All adults need to continue to follow the density and physical distancing guidelines outlined by SA Health. It is not appropriate or practical for students and children to maintain physical distancing requirements in classrooms or corridors. From Monday 29<sup>th</sup> June, there will be no cap on the number of people in one room, however physical distancing and room density requirements must be followed by adults.

<u>From Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> June,</u> the following activities can resume providing government health advice and physical distancing requirements are strictly followed:

- parents, volunteers, may again enter school and preschool grounds. We recommend parents/caregivers **Drop and Go** to ensure social distancing inside school grounds.
- School assemblies, excursions, all school sport competitions, sports days and carnivals, including inter-school competitions (the use of change rooms and shower facilities is not permitted) will recommence. Inter-school choirs, bands and other performing art activities, school discos, playgroups will all recommence as well.

Requirements that remain in place:

- It is important that students and adults stay home if they are unwell.
- The general public should not access school playgrounds or play equipment.
- Parents must continue to physical distance, including at school pick up and drop off.
- Interstate and overseas travel remains on hold.

#### A reminder for your calendar

The first day of Term 3, Monday, 20th July will be a Pupil Free Day, so our school will recommence for students on Tuesday, 21st July.

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
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
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
